

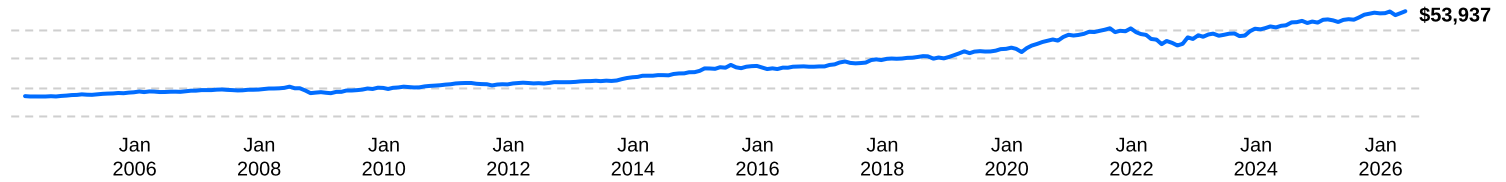

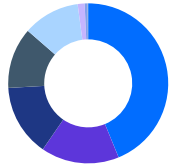
Why invest in Dynamic Blue Chip Balanced Fund ?

Growth of \$10,000

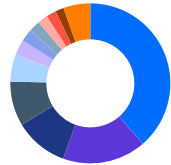


Asset Allocation (%)



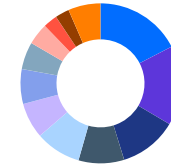
